Translated into Chinese by a long time friend Lin Hwai Min, the film was in four parts and 2 hours long in total. Eiko performed her solo following the intermission and the event also included a lively discussions with audience members. The event was, in total, four and a half hours long! It was an intense experience for Eiko to see the film projected so large with a full audience and the darkness of the theater. Eiko is deeply grateful for the Cloud Gate theater, its staff, and Lin Hwai Min.

Eiko was busy during her two week return to Tokyo this summer as she performed two duets in collaboration with two friends. At MOMAT (The National Museum of Modern Art, Tokyo), Eiko performed while poet Forrest Gander wrote words and phrases, inspiring and responding to each other. At NWEC (National Women's Education Center of Japan) Eiko worked with Nicole Gordon, acting as her interpreter but also a collaborator in remembering Nicole's late mother (and Eiko and Koma's dear friend) Beate Gordon. Beate, at the age of 22, was the youngest and one of the two female members of the US team who drafted the Japanese Constitution. Read <u>Nicole's speech</u>, interpreted by Eiko.
