On November 20th, Tan will perform two pieces by Henry Cowell. Though the concert piano looks so small in the gigantic Cathedral, the sound vibrates beautifully throughout the entire nave without any amplification. It is quite an experience. This week Eiko is hard at work at the Cathedral rehearsing different kinds of short duets with five more collaborators. Filmmaker Alexis Moh, poet/performer Mark McCloughan, and rapper/painter DonChristian Jones, young artists with rich collaborating history with Eiko, will participate in the showing. She is also working with two artists who are deceased, painter Chikuha Otake (1878-1936) and poet C.D. Wright (1949-2016).
